ACF is a national organization committed to serving independent consulting foresters who manage forests and market forest products for private woodland owners. In 2024, the Chapter aligned its meetings with the California Licensed Foresters Association (CLFA), hosted a specialized workshop on hiring and retention, and launched a targeted outreach campaign, including assistance with hosting the 2025 ACF Western Regional Conference and Practice of Consulting Forestry course, that led to several new candidate members.

"Our chapter may be small, but we are strategic, focused, and committed to growing the next generation of California's consulting foresters," said Chapter Chair Jacob Harrower. "This award is a testament to the energy and initiative of our members."

The California Chapter also strengthened ties with organizations like the California Forestry Association and Forest Landowners of California, actively participated in legislative and regulatory discussions, and helped bring consulting foresters' voices to the table in both state and national forestry policy.

"We are thrilled to recognize the California Chapter as the Small Chapter of the Year," said Rick Barnes, President of ACF. "This award is a testament to the chapter's continuous commitment and exceptional contributions to the association and profession."

The Alabama Chapter received the Large Chapter of the Year Award, exemplifying similar excellence within a larger membership base.
